Program: Guest Speaker Claudia (Dean) Trump of New Smyrna Beach, Florida was the January 2011 guest speaker. Dean is a Personal Property Appraiser and is licensed in Volusia County to appraise and to conduct sales. She appraises for Estates, Insurance coverage and Claims. She retired from the Navy in 1994 and she is a dealer at Avonlea Antique Mall. Dean presented a program on American Silver Overlay Decoration on Glass or as Dean calls it “Momma’s Silver Overlay”. She used overhead projections, handouts and reference books for her presentation. Dean gave a brief history of Silver Overlay; the difference between Silver Overlay, Silver Mounted, Silver Deposit and Silver Encrusted. Examples of some of the companies that provided blank glass and or pottery Heisey, Bryce, Cambridge, Paden City and Fostoria. Silver Overlay was produced in foreign countries as well as the United States. Examples of companies that produced Silver Overlay Fostoria 1910-1920, National 1920-1950, Rockwell 1900-1980, Silver City 1920-1980 and Lotus 1920-1990. After 1960 Platinum replaced Silver. To get more information on Silver Overlay visit The Library of Congress, Chatabout.com, and the West Virginia Museum of Glass.
